

**Houston VA Advanced Fellowship in Research**  
**South Central Mental Illness Research, Education, and Clinical Center (SC MIRECC)**  
**Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center (MEDVAMC; Houston)**

Applications are currently being accepted for the SC MIRECC VA Advanced Fellowship in Mental Illness Research and Treatment located at the MEDVAMC in Houston Texas. This MIRECC fellowship is a 2-year research training program (75% time devoted to research; 25% to clinical activities).

The purpose of the SC MIRECC Fellowship in Mental Illness Research and Treatment is to train professional psychologists for eventual leadership roles in research, education, and clinical services, particularly in academic and medical care settings. Although many Fellows pursue careers focused predominantly upon academic research and education in mental health, successful graduates of the program also will include those who pursue leadership careers that emphasize education and clinical contributions in the field of mental health.

By the end of the Fellowship Program, Fellows pursuing academic clinical-research careers should be ready to submit applications for career development awards (e.g., VA career development award or National Institutes of Health [NIH] K-Award). Fellows should also be ready to pursue entry-level leadership roles, which integrate state-of-the-art research, education, and clinical approaches to mental health in the VA healthcare system and other academic institutions.

#### Research Mentoring

The SC MIRECC fellowship is founded upon a team mentoring approach where each fellow works with a primary mentor and a team of research and clinical advisors. Research mentoring for the SC MIRECC psychology fellowship is centered on the areas of:

- implementation of evidence-based mental health treatments
- medical psychology, behavioral medicine, integration of mental health in primary care
- geropsychology
- anxiety disorders (including panic, GAD, and OCD)
- post-traumatic stress disorder
- outcomes research (including intervention development and clinical trials)

#### Academic Environment

The MEDVAMC is one of the largest clinical care facilities in the VA and is host to one of 14 VA Health Services Research and Development Centers of Innovation (COIN). The Houston COIN houses over 30 research investigators and 150 research staff from disciplines including medicine, psychology, psychiatry, epidemiology, and statistics/methodology. The academic affiliate for the MEDVAMC is Baylor College of Medicine (BCM), one of the top 25 medical schools in the country. Upon acceptance, incoming fellows are appointed at the level of Instructor at BCM within the Menninger Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences.

#### Training Opportunities

Working with their mentoring team, each fellow will develop a set of practice experiences that best complement their research and career goals. Recent fellows have focused on clinical rotations related to behavioral medicine, PTSD, and geropsychology.

#### IAPACT Track

We will be recruiting one fellow, out of a possible total of two, to participate in our newly funded Interprofessional Academic PACT. Houston is one of seven IAPACTs within VA nation-wide (see <http://www.va.gov/OAA/coepce/>). IAPACT is a primary care training opportunity in which trainees

work collaboratively with both trainees and supervisors from medicine, nursing, and pharmacy to provide Veteran care. This allows fellows to receive training in direct clinical work, collaboration among disciplines, supervision/teaching of multidisciplinary trainees, and provides opportunities for research or quality improvement projects in the primary care setting. The fellow recruited for this position would spend at least 30% of their time for one year in IAPACT and participate in the fellowship research activities the other 70% of their time. If you are interested in this track, please specify this in your cover letter.

### Stipend and Benefits

- Full-time salary (approx. \$47,000 for first year, \$50,000 for the second year)
- Vacation (13 days per annum); Sick Leave (13 days per annum)
- Benefits as applicable including eligibility for health and dental insurance
- Authorized leave for professional conferences (travel funds usually available)
- \$7,000 in research start-up funds
- \$1,000 for books and supplies

### Requirements

- U.S. citizens who are candidates in or have completed an APA-accredited doctoral program in clinical/counseling psychology and are enrolled or completed an APA-accredited internship
- Doctoral requirements including dissertation must be completed before fellowship
- Anticipated start date is flexible (between July 1 and September 1)
