Directors Update



The attack on Ukraine has impacted many of our Nation's Veterans, including those who served in combat and experienced war-related stress and trauma in Iraq and Afghanistan. Providers throughout VA are working to support our Veterans and their families who are experiencing distress in this time of uncertainty. In the Mid-Atlantic MIRECC we are honored to support our Veterans' mental health and resilience through research spanning the range of translational science.

Our basic research includes studies of animal models of traumatic brain injury and mental illness, as well as genetics and genomics research. We are conducting clinical trials of treatments for several mental health problems that affect Veterans, and we are evaluating the implementation of local, regional and national programs for Veterans.

Current projects include:

- Research and training on moral injury care and a new moral injury consultation program;
- · Development of novel therapeutic interventions for chronic pain and commonly co-occurring mental health problems;
- · Innovative application of new extended reality (XR) immersive technologies to train the next generation of VA providers and address Veterans' mental health needs.

The Mid-Atlantic MIRECC exists to understand and address the mental health needs of Iraq- and Afghanistan-era Veterans and their families. We work to inform VA's efforts to equip Veterans with the knowledge and skills to support optimal psychosocial functioning and wellbeing throughout their lives, especially in times such as these.





Program for Advancing Cognitive
disorders Education for Rural Staff

PACERS is an education program for health care staff who care for Veterans with cognitive disorders and their caregivers. While this program targets rural health care staff, providers working in any setting can benefit from this information.

The PACERS online training curriculum includes six e-learning courses; each course
