Director's Update



Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 saw continued productivity and growth for the Mid-Atlantic (VISN 6) MIRECC. I am delighted to report that our ongoing scientific dissemination efforts produced 73 scientific and professional publications in FY 2022, including 53 published papers, 16 advance online publications and 1 book chapter.

We also promoted strategic development by growing our portfolio of funded research, education, and clinical demonstration projects. Specifically, MIRECC investigators obtained over \$4M in grants in FY 2022, compared to \$3.5M for FY 2021, a 12.5% increase. In addition, two of our MIRECC's signature studies -- the Post-Deployment Mental Health Longitudinal (PDMH-L) Study and the Post-Deployment Mental Health Data Repository -- resumed participant recruitment and data analysis safely within the evolving context of the COVID-19 pandemic. Many thanks to the amazing team of MIRECC core directors, lab leaders, investigators, affiliates, and stakeholders who made 2022 a terrific year.

 Transdermal Rotigotine as Adjunct to

 Behavioral Therapy for Cocaine Use I

Awards

Behavioral Therapy for Cocaine Use Disorder. Cooperative Agreement award from the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIH) to Virginia Commonwealth University, awarded on September 2022.

The goal of this project is to determine if six weeks of daily application of a transdermal patch of a multiple-DAreceptor agonist reduces cocaine use and increases brain activation signals indicative of greater top-down frontocortical control in persons with cocaine use disorder (CUD) who are undergoing behavioral therapy (compared to those on six weeks of placebo patches). In addition to including community adults with CUD in the Richmond area, Veterans from the Richmond VA will be recruited for this trial using a referral protocol.



PACERS is an education program for health care staff who care for Veterans with cognitive disorders and their caregivers. While this program targets rural health care staff, providers working in any setting can benefit from this information.

The PACERS online training curriculum includes six e-learning courses; each courses is accredited for 1 hour of continuing education. There are also 5 videos that cover important topics related to cognitive impairment, including driving, self-neglect, challenging behaviors, Alzheimer's disease, and end-of-life.
